LAMB Annual Conference

Several members of Friends of Latvia were in Latvia in late August for the annual conference meetings, which were hosted by Matras and Tasi congregations. Mary Garber (Pittsburgh, PA), Rev. Jesse Sowell, Mark and Julie Croft, and Melissia Mason (all of Grapevine, TX), and Bishop Debra Wallace-Padgett and Rev. Lee Padgett of the North Alabama Conference were all in attendance. y wife and I recently went to see the movie *War Room*. If you haven't seen it yet, I strongly encourage you to do so. It is a film by Christian film maker Alex Kendrick centering on the life of a successful real estate agent, her successful salesman husband and young daughter.

War Room focuses on the mentoring relationship that develops between an elderly client who is selling her house and the real estate agent. The agent shares with the woman the story of her lagging faith, disintegrating marriage and family life, and how she sees no way to fix it. The agent tells the woman she is tired of all the fighting, struggle, and heartache and is about to give up.

The elderly woman shares with the agent that maybe she is not "fighting" the right way and that maybe she needs new tools and a "battle plan."

The woman then takes the agent up to her "war room." It is a small room with walls filled with scripture verses, prayer requests and a place for her to pray. The woman indicates that this is the place where her battles are waged and suggested maybe the agent build a war room and begin a battle to save her marriage and family.

What transpires is a story of prayer, forgiveness, and God's grace that slowly begins to restore and transform the agent's marriage and family life. The climactic scene shows the elderly woman in her "war room" giving thanks to God for bringing the agent into her life. She then launches in to a soliloquy of prayer as the camera cuts to shots of people across the country praying, people dealing with different problems and issues of their life and her asking God to "raise them up, raise them up Lord." Her voice builds to a thundering crescendo as the movie ends.

As I walked out of the theatre, my thoughts turned to Latvia and our special relationship/partnership. This movie reminded me vividly of the transformational power of prayer, God's unending grace and forgiveness, and how we can continually raise each other up through prayer. So to all of you... consider yourself "raised up"!

HOPE CENTER 2015

Our Volunteers in Mission (VIM) from First United Methodist Church, Tullahoma, TN went to Liepa, Latvia to work at the Hope Center. The team consisted of Craig Diller (a first time VIM member), Rebekah Diller, Kenny Helms, Jim McClure, Doug Thomas, Dudley Tipps, and Holt Cason. The original plan was to arrive August 7, but American Airlines failed to cooperate and we arrived on August 8 and were greeted by Gita and Juris Mednis and Rihards Germans.

After touring the Salaspils Concentration Camp, and the Jewish memorial at Rumbula in Riga on Saturday, we arrived at the Salvation Army house in Skangali where we roomed during our trip. Sunday was a leisure day after attending a combined service of Latvian and Russian speaking congregations in Liepa.

Early Monday morning, our team arrived at the Hope Center and began removing old wall paper from one of the bedrooms, the main hall and the kitchen area of the building. After the wallpaper was removed, we spackled holes and cracks in the sheetrock and then sanded the walls to achieve a smooth surface for painting.

On Wednesday, we were finally in a position to begin applying a base coat of sealant to the walls, and after that dried, we began painting. The colors were chosen to be bright to help psychologically with the long, drab winter months.

In addition to the ripping, tearing, spackling, sanding, and painting, we installed a new light fixture, a new light control device and new crown molding in the hallway and bedroom.

While the work was meaningful and will give the girls and their babies at the Hope Center a cleaner, brighter and more colorful environment, spending time with the residents was the most enjoyable part of the trip.

On the last day of our VIM trip, we visited the Hill of Crosses at Siauliai, Lithuania to remember those of previous teams that have passed on to be with our Lord. •

FOL 2016 in Latvia!


June 27—July 3, 2016

Remembering Richard Lee (Bud) Vann Oct. 14, 1933-July 23, 2015

Budd Vann was a member of the first American team to come to Wesley Camp in 2005. The North Alabama Conference, under the leadership of its Bishop, Robert Fanning and its Missions director Patrick Friday, had used its annual conference offering to finance the

purchase of the 20 acre dairy farm which became known as Wesley Camp. The team was made up of 35 leaders and missioners from the North Alabama Conference and the Red Bird Missionary Conference. Following the Dedication service on a cold and windy day the team attacked the 10 year neglected farm and made a very sizable start into the task of creating a summer camp and retreat center.

Upon leaving Latvia after that first trip Bud remarked, "We'll be back." Indeed we were! In 2006, only weeks after losing his beloved wife Gail to cancer, Bud again joined a team headed for Wesley Camp. Over the next 8 years Bud made 8 more trips to Latvia and Wesley Camp and the Hope Center. He was a tireless worker and expressed a great love for Latvia, Wesley Camp and the wonderful people who are the Methodist Church in Latvia. He first attended the Friends of Latvia

meeting when it met in Fargo North Dakota and was a faithful member of this organization the rest of his life.


Budd was an active member of the several Methodist churches to which he belonged and with his wife was actively involved in VIM work. They made many trips to

> South America on mission trips. Bud also served on the Board of Trustees of the North Alabama Conference and was very instrumental in building the new Conference Center on the Campus of Birmingham Southern College.

> Bud expressed two regrets as his health began to fail. He had planned to attend the FOL conference in Grapevine, TX earlier this year but was in the hospital at the time of the conference. Then

after his diagnosis of terminal cancer he expressed that his greatest disappointment was in not being able to go to Latvia one more time.

Bud's memorial service was held at the Mountain Chapel UMC in Birmingham, AL on August 29. At his request his children suggested that memorials be designated to Wesley Camp and the Hope Center in Latvia. •
