The summer was quite busy! We thank our Lord and all of the wonderful volunteers from near and far who worked to make all of our camps a meeting place of believers and seekers on Holy Ground OF CAMP WESLEY. Several teens and young adults shared that they had finally fully accepted Christ as their Savior. We also want to thank all of you who donated funds to make it possible for those who could not afford to attend camp receive scholarships.

Hope Center

The Hope Center's donations have fallen sharply. This vital ministry can not exist long without help from you. The ministry has helped many, many young mothers and their babies for over 12 years and is still as needed today as in the past. The Hope Center is at maximum capacity. God has given us this opportunity to serve His "least of them". We are often the only hope for these mothers who need a caring heart and safe sanctuary. This ministry helps young women learn how to be responsible mothers and gives them the opportunity to fight to keep their babies, instead of having to give up parental rights. Social Services public budget continues to be very meager and therefore they are only capable to continue their support at the same levels as over the past 10 years. They contribute approximately 1/3 of the total cost to help each mother. Some

mothers get no aid whatsoever and their expenses must be totally covered by the

Greetings From Edgars Šneiders continued...

Cēsis UMC has a blessed confirmation class, but they receive a lot of attacks from Satan, therefore they need prayers about God's protection. A heating furnace fan has broken. It has to be fixed to provide heating.

There are several remodeling projects going on at Riga First UMC. Two rooms on the second floor are being redecorated, one of them the District Office, and also one room in the basement is being remodeled. Thanks to receiving funds for a social outreach project, the work in the basement has to be finished in 2 months time. Lately several of the members had become sick and gone to hospital. Now, they have started getting back to health and the worship attendance has increased. Some of the members have understood the value of prayers, therefore now they have scheduled Sunday morning prayer time an hour before the worship. We pray also about the wooden building next to the church and which is owned by the UMC in Latvia, it is in a critical condition.

Kuldīga UMC recently visited Liepa Latvian UMC, a total of 14 members, including pastor Zinta Dzintara. The heating system had malfunctioned in the summer time, but after prayers and God's intervention, now it works again. A shower has been installed, also – a washing machine, therefore people with no other options can come to church to get washed and do laundry. Kitchen is still under construction. Sunday school has started a month ago. One of the youth is willing to teach children to sing. One new member has been accepted recently. We pray about an Afterschool program director.

Tāši UMC recently visited Paplaka UMC. Together with Mātras UMC they organized a fellowship bus trip for adults and children to Usma town. They need prayers about Aivija who is soon to finish 12th grade. It is possible that she would like to study in the Christ's discipleship school, but that would require funding.

Liepāja UMC recently accepted a new member. A wedding was held. Several youth are attending confirmation class. We pray that God would help them become strong in their faith, and also about the other youth who attend the youth meeting on Tuesdays. The heating season has started. This will be the last year that heating furnaces are used, next year it is planned that the congregation will be connected to the centralized city heating system. We pray that the rebuild is successful and we have enough funds. We continue to pray about a new PA system, which is a current need. God has answered our prayers about the Sunday school, the curriculum will restart on November 6. The Afterschool program has also resumed its work. They need helping hands to expand the ministry.

Mātras UMC has a new pastor serving since September – Jānis Grunte. A new piano player has been found who plays every Sunday at worship. There are several options to improve the electricity and heating issues. They are in prayers about a youth leader so that the youth work would develop.

Liepa Russian UMC has ongoing active Afterschool program. In the first month there were 27 children attending. Now the daily attendance is between 10 and 15. We are in prayers about finances so that this blessed ministry would continue. They are also in prayers about several teens who have alienated from church.

In Sarkaņi UMC we pray about a Sunday school leader and children, and also about a man called Nikolai, who has huge health problems.

At Riga Second UMC big repair work is planned soon. 8 windows are about to be replaced, the roof has to be insulated. Soon the showers will be finished, that would hopefully help with a new ministry to the neighboring people. The congregation is in prayers to understand which would be the better way to reach people of Pārdaugava with the Good News.

UMC in Latvia is still praying about the wooden building next to Riga First UMC, due to unclear situation about its future. Designing a current and high quality home page is also a current and great need.


March 20-21, 2017 | Camp Sumatanga, Alabama

Greetings from Jeanie Reimer

In Mission Together

I would like to take this opportunity to introduce myself to those that I do not know and to say Hello to those of you that I do know. My name is Jeanie Kurka Reimer and I am a consultant for Global Ministries of the United Methodist Church. I have met some of you at past Friends of Latvia Gatherings and also met some of you at the Latvia Annual Conference this past summer.

For the past several years, I have been an In Mission Together (IMT) Partnership Coordinator for Lithuania. Recently, I have been asked to take on the role of Partnership Coordinator for Latvia which I am thrilled to do. My main role and purpose is to help to support partnerships using the concepts of In Mission Together and the framework of the 50/50 Covenant.



In mid-August, I traveled to Latvia to attend the Latvian Annual Conference and in early November to meet with the pastors, lay people and the new District Superintendent. We had a wonderful conversation/meeting last week talking about the tenets of In Mission Together and the concept of the 50/50 Covenant which I know is a conversation that many of you have begun to have. For those of you not as familiar with these two concepts, let me provide some information.

In Mission Together (IMT) is an initiative of Global Ministries which is a global partnership network available to equip conferences, districts, and churches for transformational partnerships in mission in your local community, the United States, and around the world. A traditional approach to mission is often needs-based and short-term relief whereas the IMT vision of partnership embraces asset-based and long-term development and relationships. The 50/50 Covenant is a sacred covenant for both partners to participate equally, 50/50, as the body of Christ, by utilizing each partner's skills and resources. A 50/50 framework is at the core of IMT as it works to prevent dependency and foster self-sufficiency. These principles address systemic issues rather than treating symptoms. IMT is GLOCAL (meaning these concepts are applicable for both global and local mission work) and equips you with core values that are cross-culturally appropriate for a variety of contexts whether in the United States or around the world.

I look forward to continuing this discussion with our friends in Latvia as well as the partners here in the United States. Hopefully, we will be able to meet soon and have some face-to-face discussion on these topics. In the meantime, please let me now if you have any questions.
