Face Time

Because Jesus stressed the importance of our relationships with God and with each other, it's pretty certain that face time with our brothers and sisters in Christ is important. That's why, in addition to the time we spend together, new technologies that multiply this face time can offer us efficient ways to plan our work and to grow in faith together despite distances. For the technophobes, here are the straight facts on these technologies.

Synchronous communications require people to meet at the same time. Examples are live conversations, telephone calls, conference calls, instant messaging (IM). Skype is a free service on the internet that enables free synchronous voice communications and, with a webcam, video phone calls. (Smile!!) People who use Skype a lot like to use inexpensive headsets with a microphone. Download Skype at Skype.com. The discussion on the Skype website about payment options is if you want to call someone's regular phone using skype. If you call via internet Skype to Skype then it's free.

Asynchronous communication is when people meet but not at the same time. Examples are voicemail, websites, weblogs (AKA blogs). With asynchronous communications you post information and others read it later and they might even post a response. This allows posting of reference materials or photos for future retrieval. Facebook uses this method and it has become a tool for communicating and planning.

Latvia In Mission Together

Dear friends and supporters of the Latvian ministry, the entire Latvia IMT team and the district would like to say thank you for your undying support. Without your commitment, your prayers, your resources and your participation it would have been impossible to accomplish the task of bringing the Latvian pastors to the Maryville District for pastor training. What an incredible opportunity it was for us and for them.

On Friday and Saturday, April 29-30, the pastors attended the Friends of Latvia at Maryville 1st UMC. Connecting congregations found it a blessing to have their pastor here in Maryville, some for the very first time, and it also allowed the pastors to visit local and connecting congregations.

On Sunday, May 1st, the pastors attended Sunday services throughout the district. The evening was spent having dinner provided by Alcoa 1st UMC followed by worship, testimony and celebration as many from the district attended. Each Latvian pastor also took the opportunity to speak about their congregation and how Christ has been revealed to them in their walk with him. After each pastor spoke, a Maryville district pastor would lead prayer for the Latvian pastor, their church and their ministries.

The week at Camp Wesley Woods was filled with training, case studies, worship, reflection, visits to local ministries, visits to our smaller churches, shopping and fellowship. We learned so much about the needs and challenges of our Latvian family; and they also learned that we have the same challenges. The main focus during training was to provide them with material and life examples of dealing with spiritual, social and economic issues within the life of the church and the people in their communities.

Latvia is not any different than here in America. The issues and challenges that we face with children, family, spouses, work, health, finances and our spiritual life here in America are just as difficult in Latvia. It would be impossible to put into words the partnership benefit that exists between the Maryville District and Latvia. But suffice it to say, the benefit is not one-sided. The partnership is about sharing the love of Christ in all things. It's about encouraging our brothers and sisters in Christ and giving each other hope. Now there is something that we can learn from our Latvian family.

I found myself reflecting on the story of our Latvian family and how hard it must have been through the occupation, but then I remember how full of encouragement that they are to us. They desired to move forward and not to dwell on the past, but use the past as a springboard to the future.

Most of you know one of our retiring pastors, Ken Abbott, and the wonderful spirit he has for sharing Christ. Ken came to lead one of the sessions and he brought such a spirit of hope and encouragement. The Latvian pastors were so encouraged by Ken's gift of both humor and love of Christ. There are many, many stories I could share about the week. From Jeff Wadley and his river rocks and puzzle pieces to Jane Taylor and Christian conferencing but there aren't enough words and ink to do justice to the work that Christ has done in and for the pastors and for the team that lead this week.

Many thanks go out to the churches that hosted the pastors in their Sunday morning services. Many thanks go out to the churches and individuals that provided food, goodie bags, bed linens, towels, transportation, computers, financial assistance, prayers, time, teaching, worship, facilities and on and on. There is just so much to be thankful for and Maryville District, it is because of your generosity, your love and gifts and your love of Christ that we were able to host this week.

One gift that we were able to provide to the Latvian pastors was a trip to Cokesbury bookstore. As you can imagine, there are not a lot of resources available in Latvia to assist them in further education and study. Through your financial gifts, they were able to purchase resource material to take back with them and to share with their fellow pastors who could not make the trip. One resource that they lacked was a common lectionary volume of books called "Feasting on the Word". The set costs about \$400 and, as a gift, we were able to purchase a set for them to take back to the district. With Latvia about the size of Virginia, it would be difficult for 12 pastors to benefit from a single resource. On faith, we decided to purchase two sets so that the texts could be more accessible. If you or your congregation would like to assist in the purchase of the second set please send your donation to the Maryville District office and on the memo line put "Latvia - Feasting on the Word". We will be shipping these books along with other materials in the coming weeks.

We are so thankful for all you have done in the name of Christ to make this journey possible. We will continue to be active in our support of Latvia and the pastors in the future and we hope and pray that you will decide to become more involved as well. There will be a group coming from the Kuldiga congregation in June to the Maryville District, as well as groups to Latvia in the near future. Committee Meeting Report



In a joint meeting with the Latvian and Russian speaking congregation pastors, Ilzite Ozola and Vera Titovica from Liepa, Latvia, we discussed their congregations, current needs, vision for the future, and how supporting churches could help.

Both pastors were very appreciative of having a new sanctuary in Liepa and felt that it would help increase attendance

and membership at the church.

Pastor Ozola reported on her ministry at Sarkani, an extremely poor, government housing sector in Liepa. It is felt that the alcoholic rate at Sarkani is 100% for men and 90% for women. These people, especially the children, need help. Pastor Ozola is receiving financial support from the Trussville, AL church presently and feels that the money is sufficient for the ministry at Sarkani at this time. However, if the money decreases or disappears, she will not be able to supply food for these families. (See supplemental information in Section 14 of the LAMB Reports 2010-2011).

Pastor Ozola asked for support for training youth of the community by funding them for youth camp. This past summer, money was raised to send a number of youth from Liepa to JOSIAHVENTURE (www.josiahventure. com) camp for a week. The report from the camp stated that 17 youth accepted Christ during the week. A number of youth from Liepa are now meeting weekly at the church in Liepa for Bible studies and fellowship. Recently, Josiahventure was given 6 acres of land in Latvia to expand their operation and to hopefully build

a permanent youth camp facility in the future. (See supplemental information in Section 16 of the LAMB Reports 2010-2011)

Pastor Titovica reported on the After-school program that she conducts in Liepa. She stated that daily attendance is 12-14 children. The children play games, do their homework and hear a Bible story. The children are given hot soup and a jelly sandwich before going home. Pastor Titovica said that there are no needs at this time and that she has been able to support this ministry from donations, and hopes that the financial contributions will continue. She plans to continue this project in the future. (See supplemental information in Section 7 of the LAMB Reports 2010-2011).

Pastor Titovica talked briefly about the Russian congregation at the church in Liepa. She hopes to increase attendance and involvement by developing and improving the work of Sunday school, develop a youth ministry program, and seek ways to get more people involved in church activities. Her current needs for the church are a projector, computer, screen and especially musical instruments of any kind. She feels that with music instruments, more youth will become involved in church activities and may result in the development of a praise band/worship type service. It appears that both pastors, Ozola and Titovica, are doing a great job with the church as well as outreach ministries. It is our hope, as a support committee, to continue to help the Liepa church and community with our prayers and financial support.
