Remembering the Lives of Sam Dixon and Clint Rabb

The cab driver was certain that he had dropped off UMC Global Ministries and UMCOR leaders Clint Rabb and Sam Dixon at the Montana Hotel in Port au Prince, Haiti. As they disappeared into the hotel the ground began to shake and the cab driver watched the building collapse. Each with both their legs trapped beneath a fallen wall, for fifty-five hours Clint rearranged pieces of debris in an attempt to make Sam more comfortable. Sam left this life there in Port au Prince while Clint was rescued and airlifted to Miami for medical attention. As strong as Clint was, his injuries were too much for his mortal body to survive and he joined Sam on his journey.

At friends of Latvia meetings in 2007 it was quickly apparent that creating the pastor pay financial transparency and simplification needed would be a bureaucratic nightmare. When Sam Dixon took the problem forward, a simplified funds transfer process with full transparency was in use within 90 days as a direct result of his ownership of this concern. Our Advance gifts to the Pastor Salary Fund, Hope Center and others are simple and transparent because of Sam's work on this problem. Rev. Clint Rabb was one of the original designers of the UMC Global Ministries Partner Church program and his Latvia connecting congregations were some of the first. He specifically wanted Latvia to rebuild the UMC with indigenous clergy: a foundational approach in use to this day. His biggerthan-life presence and gentle influence conveyed a love for all people of all ages and in all nations while maintaining a joyful, common sense attitude that would get things done.

Clint's trips to and mentoring at W.C. Martin UMC offered years of Spirit-guided experience that remains the glue helping hold the Riga 1st and W.C Martin partnership in place today. Both Clint and Sam would, and did, move mountains for the people of Latvia.

What Clint Rabb taught us as he mentored our church on the Global Ministries Partner Church covenant with 1st Riga UMC, Latvia:

- 1. Start every planning meeting with a prayer and a brief devotional. It's important to remember why we're planning.
- 2. Give the Spirit room to move as you make plans.



- 3. It's essential to visit your partner church at least twice every four years: ideally during each of the first two years. Your presence is extremely important.
- 4. The team should perform some local projects together before traveling to the partner church. It helps to learn each other's gifts and how to work together.
- 5. Advance directly to the destination together as a group, if possible.
- 6. Stay in pairs in the homes of the church members, rather than hotels, at the destination if you can. It's a completely different experience of understanding that changes everything.
- 8. Remember that your hosts are giving all that they have, and probably then some, to make you feel welcome. Find a gracious way to restock their pantries.
- 9. Avoid before & after photos. Take photos of their beautiful smiles: up close.
- 10. The sights and smells that may make us uncomfortable look and smell like life.
- 11. There are three phases in the covenant in sequence:
 - a) Everyone's overjoyed,
 - b) Americans are crazy and
 - c) a healthy covenant relationship.

Be aware when you are in #1 and #2 so you can get to #3 quickly.

Get some well-deserved rest Sam and Clint. We'll see you soon.
